Coffee house - club for creative

There's a new coffee house in town called Opus 170.

It's located in the basement of St. George's Church, where Le Monde used to operate. But unlike its predecessor. Opus 170 is a well organized and firstclass proposition.

It's also more than just another coffee house. Alex Kubic, Opus 170's writer-inresidence, envisions the new club as a "catalyst for creative people in Ottawa," Within this context of involving local talent, anything goes - music, drama, films, discussions, dances, poetry reading, art exhibi-

The club opened for the first time Friday with a superior folk-singer, Jesse Winchester, as the featured artist. He filled the place.

Winchester's original music - better than good was well received, and the audience's enjoyment was Italian further enhanced by the surroundings. Decorater-de-

signer Jaan Krusberg has done an eminently sensible job of appointing the club, and the resulting atmosphere is clean and casual.

This common sense extends also to other things like lighting and acoustics, as well as to admission and refreshment prices.

Recording unit

Another important facet of Opus 170 is the presence of a recording studio. Operated by Chuck Gray, the studio is only the second such independent outfit of its kind in the city and will serve to complement the activities of the coffee house both esthetically and financially. Unlike the club which is open only Friday, Saturday and Sunday evenings - the studio will operate full time.
